

It was moved by Councillor Ernest Smith, seconded by Mrs. Rita Willigar, and passed, with Councillor Ripley dissenting, that the By-Law in the form following be passed and adopted:

BY-LAW OF THE TOWN OF PARRSBORO TO PROVIDE A RETIRING ALLOWANCE FOR MISS MOLLY MORWICK, TOWN CLERK

(Pursuant to Section 221 (12) of Chapter 309 RSNS 1967 of the Towns Act).

Be It Enacted and ordained as a By-Law of the Town of Parrsboro, as follows:

1. On and after the date of the retirement, of the said Molly B. Morwick, Town Clerk, a retirement allowance of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars per month shall be paid to Miss Molly B. Morwick, former town employee, during the remainder of her natural life.

2. Every sum required for these payments shall be held to be a sum required for ordinary, lawful purposes of the Town, and shall be raised, levied, and collected in the same manner and in all respects as other sums required for the ordinary lawful purposes of the Town are raised, levied, and collected, and shall be made from current revenue of the Town.
