







Parrsboro, Nova Scotia

Pjila'si to Parrsboro! Once known as Awokum by the Mi'kmaq people, representing a 'short-cut' or 'passing-over point' for Mi'kmaq travellers along the Minas Basin and Cumberland County river systems.



Located on the Bay of Fundy, Parrsboro is the ideal place to explore and experience the rise and fall of the world's highest tides.

The lighthouse view overlooking the harbour is one of the best in the province and showcases both the horizontal and vertical extremes of the impressive Fundy tides. In addition to the view, the Parrsboro area is the most significant place on earth for harnessing tidal energy.

Parrsboro is also home to many Cliffs of Fundy UNESCO Global Geopark sites. Discover nearby locations by visiting fundygeopark.ca.

The tides are not the only big deal here. Parrsboro is where Canada's oldest dinosaurs once roamed! The Fundy Geological Museum shares the area's rich 350-million-year history of fossils, stones and dinosaur bones with exhibits and guided beach tours.
