

IT IS HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED by  
the Town Council of the Town of Spring-  
hill as follows:

BL/T 30-55  
(cls - Shop)

1. The By-law entitled "Early Closing By-law" as appearing in the consolidated By-laws and Ordinances of the Town of Springhill, Nova Scotia, passed by the Town Council of the Town of Springhill on the 12th day of May 1944 and approved by the Minister of Municipal Affairs on the 6th day of July 1944, be repealed, and the following substituted therefore:

2. For the purposes of this By-law unless the context otherwise requires, the expressions "ice cream parlors", "confectionery Stores", "tobacco stores", "drug stores", and jewelry stores", mean only such shops, stores or places in which no other goods, wares or merchandise are offered for sale by retail, except ice cream, candy, tobacco, drugs, fresh fruits, jewelry, temperate drinks or other like refreshments.

3. (1) Except as herein otherwise provided, all classes of shops, stores or places in the Town of Springhill in which goods, wares or merchandise are exposed or offered for sale by retail, except ice cream, candy, tobacco, drugs and jewelry stores shall be closed to customers.

- (a) On each Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday of every week between the hours of five-thirty o'clock in the afternoon and seven-thirty o'clock of the following morning, and
- (b) On each Saturday of every week between the hours of ten-thirty o'clock in the afternoon and seven-thirty o'clock of the next following Monday morning, and
- (c) On each Wednesday of every week between the hours of twelve o'clock and seven-thirty o'clock of the following morning, and
- (d) during the whole of each of the following days, that is to say: New Years Day, Good Friday, Victoria Day, Dominion Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and every day appointed by proclamation by the Governor-General, or Lieutenant Governor as a general holiday, or for a general fast or thanksgiving.

(2) The provisions of this section respecting the early

closing of such shops, stores, or places shall not apply to any afternoon or evening between the seventeenth day of December and the twenty-fourth day of December, both inclusive, in each and every year or to any Wednesday afternoon or evening immediately preceding any of the public holidays mentioned in paragraph (d) of sub section one hereof.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in Section 2 of this By-law, all such shops, stores or places may remain open to customers until nine o'clock of any afternoon or evening nextprevious to any of the public holidays mentioned in paragraph (d) of said section.

4 3. No person shall by himself, his clerk, servant or agent, directly or indirectly, offer for sale, sell, barter, or deliver any goods, wares or merchandise in or from any shop, store or place to which this By-law applies on any of the days or between the hours mentioned in this By-law for the closing of such shops, stores or places.

5 4. No person shall by himself, his clerk, servant or agent, open or keep open any shop, store or place to which this By-law applies for the purpose of selling or delivering therefrom to any customer or person any goods, wares or merchandise, or allow any customer or person to enter any such shop, store or place for the purpose of buying therein, or taking therefrom any goods, wares or merchandise on any of the days or between the hours mentioned in this By-law for the closing of such shops, stores or places.

5. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor

more than forty dollars, and in default of payment to imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty days.
